07-22-19, 0957 hrs.

McVeigh Auto Service, 201 Baltimore Pike, reported a theft. A catalytic converter was removed from a vehicle being serviced. The theft is under investigation.

07-24-19, 1248 hrs.

Party City, 601 Baltimore Pike, reported a retail theft. Three females were observed concealing merchandise while shopping in the store. One of the suspects, Arlena Porter-Robinson, 29 years old from Philadelphia, left the store with a duffle bag full of merchandise and put the items in a parked car. She then returned to the store. Police detained the three suspects and placed Porter-Robinson under arrest. The other females were identified and released. Porter-Robinson was charged with Retail Theft. Det.
