10-31-17 0839 hrs

Report of a subject in the area of Baltimore Pike and Sproul Rd possibly smoking marijuana and vandalizing a street sign. Springfield officers stopped a male matching the description. Sean Schexnayder, 50 yrs old from Springfield, admitted to smoking marijuana and "tagging" a street sign near the Springfield Mall. Schexnayder was in possession of a red marker and officers located a "No Left Turn" sign vandalized with red marker. Schexnayder was arrested and cited for Criminal Mischief.
