12-05-16 @ 1522 HRS.

A resident from the 300 Blk. of Avon Rd. reported that sometime between 0850 hrs. and the time of the report, someone entered her home and stole an engagement ring and wedding band. Entry was made through an unsecured door in the rear of the home and the jewelry was taken from a second floor bedroom. The items are valued in excess of \$16,000.00. The incident is under investigation by Detective James Devaney.

An employee at Springfield Hospital reported that sometime between 0700 hrs. and the time of the report someone stole her BLACK IPHONE7 from her desk in the Physical Therapy Dept. at the hospital. The phone is valued in excess of \$600.00.
