12-04-17 0700 hrs.

Several residents living in the Colonial Park area reported thefts/attempted thefts from their vehicles. All vehicles were left unlocked and parked either in the driveway or on the street. A total of 12 vehicles were entered along Welsh Dr., Claremont Rd., Colonial Park Dr. and Hawarden Rd. 10 of the vehicles were rummaged through with nothing stolen. 1 vehicle was missing \$2 in loose change. 1 vehicle had 2 scooters stolen from the trunk valued at \$95.
